

## Hi Folks,

Just a little update as we're all getting ready for the upcoming summer. Let's hope the summer is as amazing as the winter was. The last week we had quite an unbelievable meltdown which gave us high hopes for an early Spring. But as I sit here writing this, I'm told we should expect at least 8" of snow tonight. Time will tell but Spring does eventually show up every year.

This Newsletter will in part fulfill an obligation we have to notify landowners of our plans for Eurasian Water Milfoil (EWM) abatement efforts. Shortly after the 15<sup>th</sup> of June we will be applying aquatic pesticides in Buskey Bay and Lake Millicent. Like last year in Twin Bear, we will also be building a barrier across the north end of Lake Millicent to help contain the pesticide in higher concentrations over the areas where we have excessive EWM. This process has again helped the Pike Chain of Lakes Association qualify for a DNR grant to cover a large portion of the cost.

As always thanks for all your support and we'll see you out on the lakes and at the Annual Meeting Saturday August 12th at the Community Center.

## **NOTICE** to Property Owners on the Pike Chain

Northern Aquatic Services Professional Aquatic Weed Control Services 1061 240<sup>th</sup> Street Dresser WI 54009

Dear Lake Shore Property Owner,

The intent of this letter is to notify you that the Pike Chain of Lakes Association has hired Northern Aquatic Services, an herbicide application company for hire, to treat the nuisance exotic Eurasian watermilfoil in the Pike Chain. The Wisconsin DNR is in the process of issuing a permit for a total of 22.1 acres in the Pike Chain including 11.7 acres in Buskey Bay, and 10.4 acres in Millicent. The herbicides I will use are ProcellaCOR EC at 4.0 to 4.5 PDU and 2,4-D Amine at 4.0 PPM ae. <u>Any water usage restrictions for the treated area will be posted on **yellow signs** in that area.</u>

The permit application requires all property owners to be notified that the permit application is being made and that they may obtain a copy of the application to review. You may view the permit application at the following web site: <a href="IRPCLA website">IRPCLA website</a> (www.pikechain.org)
The planned treatment is in accordance with the Pike Chain's Aquatic Plant Management Plan (APM Plan) to control Eurasian watermilfoil. Questions concerning the APM Plan can be directed to Al Bochler of the Iron River Area Lakes Association. A copy of the permit may be obtained from the Lake Association.

I am scheduled to make the treatment in late spring or early summer 2023.
